Below are some activities related to concepts being taught in our kindergarten classroom. To help your child review and master these concepts, **please choose at least 3 activities each week for him/her to do as homework.** Circle the activities completed. Week 1

1. Gather some objects (maybe coins) and make the following patterns: AB, ABC, AAB, AABB.
2. Sort a bunch of household items by size, shape, and color.
3. Write a list of 7 farm animals.
4. After reading a book, find a period, exclamation point, quotation mark, and a question mark. Name each one, and tell why writers use each of these punctuation marks.

Week 2

1. Retell a favorite story to someone in your family. Don't forget to use character names. Also, tell your favorite part and why. Finally, tell a connection that you made to the story.
2. Read a story and list five words to describe the main character.
3. Practice adding and subtracting with the Voki on our classroom website at <http://ribblett.weebly.com>.
4. Count to 100 by 1's, 5's and 10's. If you can do that, then try to count to 100 by 2's.

Week 3

1. Use household objects to make up three addition and subtraction problems and solve them.
2. Retell a favorite story to someone in your family. Don't forget to use character names. Also, tell your favorite part and why. Finally, tell a connection that you made to the story.
3. Practice adding and subtracting with the Voki on our classroom website at <http://ribblett.weebly.com>.
4. Think of a fun way to write your Word Wall Words. Here are some ideas that you could use: sidewalk chalk; paint; special marker; glitter glue; crayons; write in rice, sand, shaving cream, or hot chocolate powder; write on a wipe off board

Week 4

1. Finish this sentence: *The world would be a better place if everyone...*
2. Go on a shape hunt. Find things that are shaped like a circle, square, rectangle, oval, hexagon, and diamond. Be sure to tell an adult the shape name. Then, try to find some 3D shapes – cylinder, cube, sphere, and cone.
3. Read a poem that has rhyming words. Identify the words that rhyme.
4. Neatly write the numbers 1-30.
