Transportation




- o Each student should wear the provided nametag the first few days of school with the student's home bus number on the back.

- o If your child is a car rider, he or she will also get a car rider tag for his or her bookbag.



 Sneakers are the most appropriate footwear for active kindergarten students. Children may not play on equipment if they wear slip on shoes.






- Book bag that is large enough to hold the Take Home Folder and Bag - of- Books bag




Kid Writing...

Students :



- Provides opportunities for gross motor development






Sneakers are the most appropriate footwear for active kindergarten students. Children may not play on equipment if they wear shoes that fall off easily.


<u>Bag - of - Books</u>



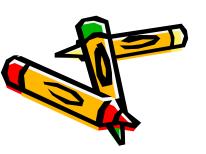




<u>Birthdays</u>

- No birthday invitations will be handed out at school unless they are for everyone in the class or for all of the girls if your child is a girl or for all of the boys if your child is a boy.




Please Note: it was decided to not allow edible treats for birthdays due to numerous student food allergies.





Traffic Light Behavior




- Every student begins on "green" each day.
- A student will be asked to move his or her fish if he or she is not following a school rule.
- At the end of the day, each student will color his or her Stoplight Sheet letting you know which color he or she ended the day on. If a student moved to warning, I will place a W on top of the green colored oval.
- I will note why the student had to move his or her fish next to the date on the Stoplight Sheet. Please refer to the key on the left hand side of the Stoplight Sheet.
- This sheet will be kept in the Take-Home Folder. At the end of each month, I will collect the sheet.






Why I had to move my fish:



<u>Meaning of Colors</u>


- <u>Green</u>-What a super day! (Maybe there was a warning, but behavior improved quickly.)
- <u>Yellow</u>- Today could have been better. If a student goes to yellow - will lose a portion of recess.
- <u>Red</u>- Today was not a good day. If a student goes to red the student will lose a portion of both recesses.
- Fish moves earn points toward missing monthly SWEB rewards.






SWEBS Rewards

- Students may receive a bee from a teacher, or any staff member, for un-bee-lievable behavior.
 Students will wear this bee for the duration of the day, receiving praise from staff and students.
- There will be school wide rewards for all students who did not exceed our clip move limit. If a student is not able to participate, he or she will miss a portion of the reward.





<u>Clip Move Limits</u>

yellow = 1 clip move; red = 2 clip moves





- September: unlimited
- October: unlimited
- November: 10 clip moves
- December: 10 clip moves
- January: 8 clip moves
- February: 8 clip moves
- March: 5 clip moves
- April: 5 clip moves *3 warnings will now equal 1 clip move
- May/June: 5 clip moves *3 warnings will continue to equal 1 clip move






